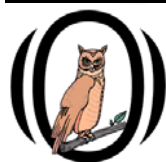

Did you hear, these computers have new software? The new computers utilize the XP operating system and have CD burning capabilities. The software includes Microsoft Office. Office contains word processing (Word), spreadsheet (Excel), database (Access), publishing (Publisher) and presentation (PowerPoint). The new computers also have easily accessible USB ports that can accommodate most flash drives.

We use a high speed internet access line and have both black and white and color printing available for a per page cost. There is a scanner in the Genealogy Room and reservations are suggested for its use. Please call the Reference Desk at extension 112 to reserve hour blocks of time.

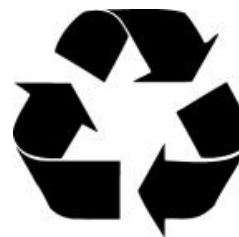

LAFAA CELEBRATES 33RD YEAR!

On January 3, 1973, Thornton Smith, Director of the Wagnalls Memorial asked the Rev. Tom Rehl, Sue Stebelton, David Baker, Joseph Dixon, James Morgan and Virginia Heffner, all local musicians, to meet for the purpose of forming a non-profit organization dedicated to providing a plan for performing and visual arts for the community. It was this first meeting which heralded the creation of the Lithopolis Area Fine Arts Association. This organization was to further Mabel Wagnalls Jones' request that the Wagnalls Foundation nourish cultural activities for this community.

Scores of renowned artists have performed in the Wagnalls Memorial auditorium, and some LAFAA artists have stayed in members' homes and attended our receptions. Many have expressed appreciation for our warm and enthusiastic audiences in an acoustically superior auditorium. Included in this group are folk singer, Jean Ritchie; folk singer and story-teller, John McCutcheon; the Ensemble Company of the Cincinnati Opera; the Columbus Symphony Strings; Robert Post; Jay Ungar and Molly Mason; Zivili Dance Troupe; The Jazz Arts Group; The Irish Brigade; The Ohio Village Singers; The Claude Kipnis Mime Company; The McClain Family blue grass musicians; the world renowned pianist, Eugene List; local vocalist, Kristin Huffman; The High Street Stompers; Tommy Dorsey Band; Anna Maria Alberghetti, soprano; The Four Freshman; The Limelighters; the Glenn Miller Band; and the Andrew Jackson Pianoforte. This piano duo is booked for the coming season on February 24, 2007.

In 1976, the first of three Fine Art and Folk Art Festivals was held on the lawn and parking lot of the Wagnalls Memorial. The last of the festivals in 1978 attracted over 6,000 people on a rainy weekend with 300 community volunteers assisting under the direction of Margaret Dixon and LAFAA Board members.

School assemblies and residencies have been a vital part of LAFAA'S artistic outreach for the Canal Winchester and Bloom-Carroll schools. This coming season's plans call for a week-long residency in creative writing and story-telling with Michelle Cornell.

We received Ohio Arts Council grants for more than 20 years, and again received a grant for this season. We were awarded the Columbus Dispatch Community Service Award and have been recognized as "the cultural bargain of Central Ohio".

Through the years, community leaders who have had special skills to offer have given countless hours of service so that LAFAA might follow the original high standards established 33 years ago. We salute those unselfish workers who have served on the governing board and as associates.

LAFAA is indebted to all of the people in the community and surrounding areas who have shown continued support of our efforts. We'd appreciate any corporate or individual financial support, as well as individuals volunteering in our organization to ensure our continued presentations of the arts for our community.
